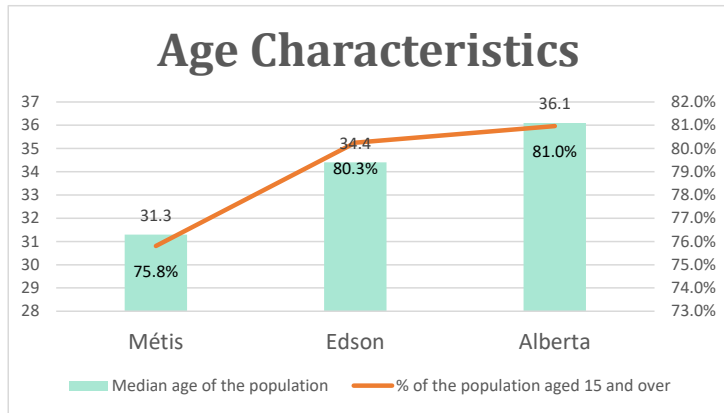

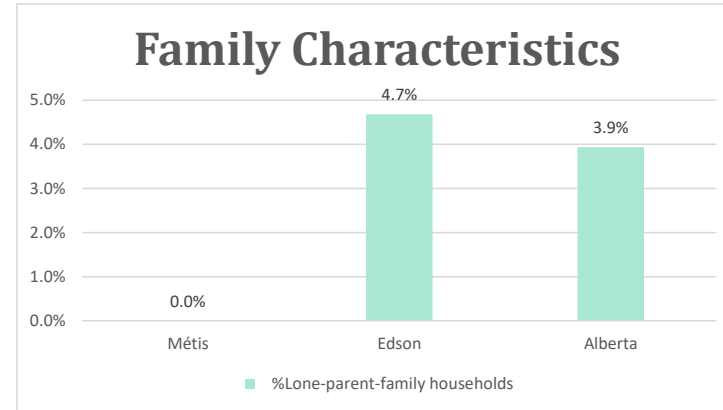

The total population reported with Métis single identity is 310 (Total Métis household is 215), representing 48% of Aboriginal people, accounting for 3.7% of the total population in Edson.

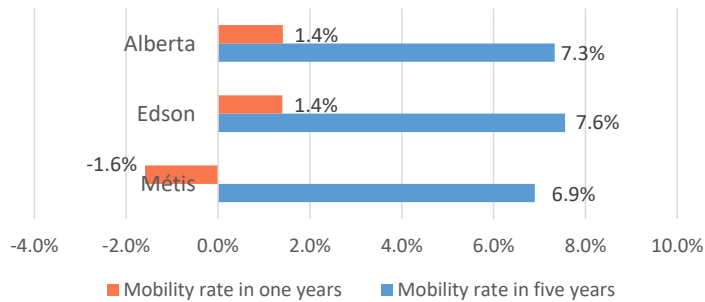


For Métis single identity population, the median age is 31.3 years old, with 75.8% of the population aged 15 and over. As for the total population, the median age is 34.4 in Edson and 36.1 years old in Alberta, with 80.3% and 81.0% population aged 15 and over respectively.



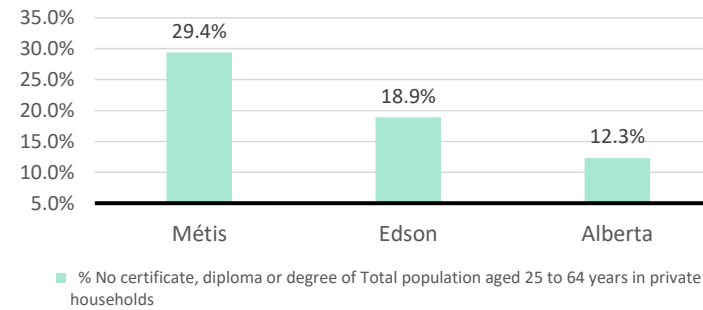
No Métis single lone parents household reported to the survey.

Education



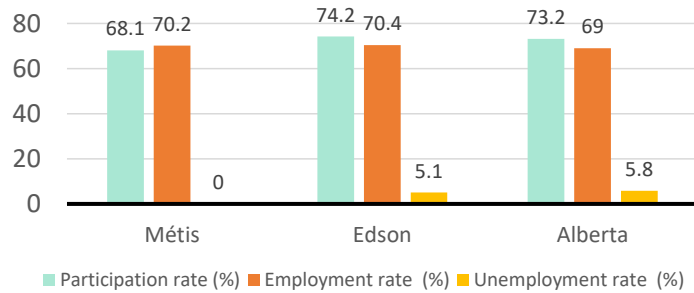
For population aged from 25 to 64 years, 29.4% Métis compared to 18.9% in Edson and 12.3% in Alberta have no certificate, diploma or degree.

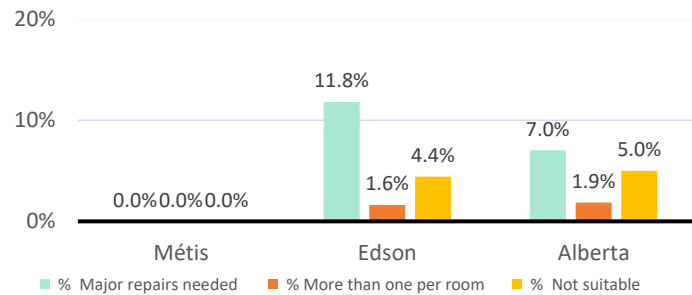
Labour Force Status



Métis participation rate is 68.1%, employment rate is 70.2%, and unemployment rate is 0.0%.

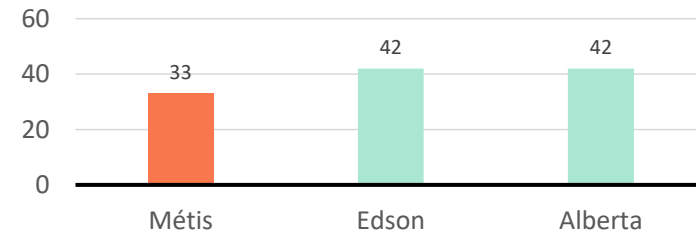
While the participation rate is lower compared with total population in Edson and Alberta (74.2% and 73.2%), no Métis reported unemployment.

Household Characteristics



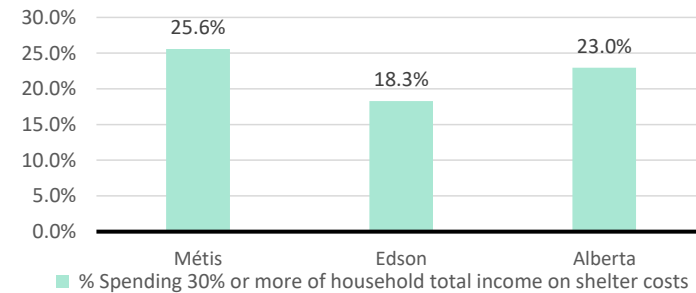
There are 215 private dwellings occupied by a Métis single household, out of which no Métis single household reported need major repairs, have more than one person per room, or not suitable.

Shelter Costs



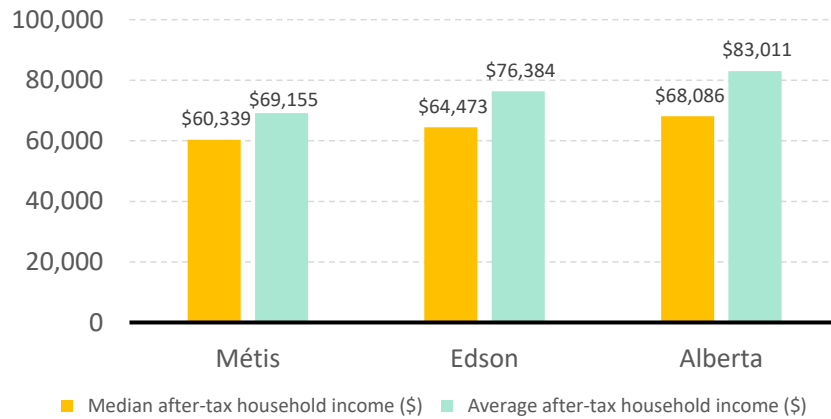
The number of Métis households spending 30% or more of household total income on shelter costs is 55, which is 25.6%

Income

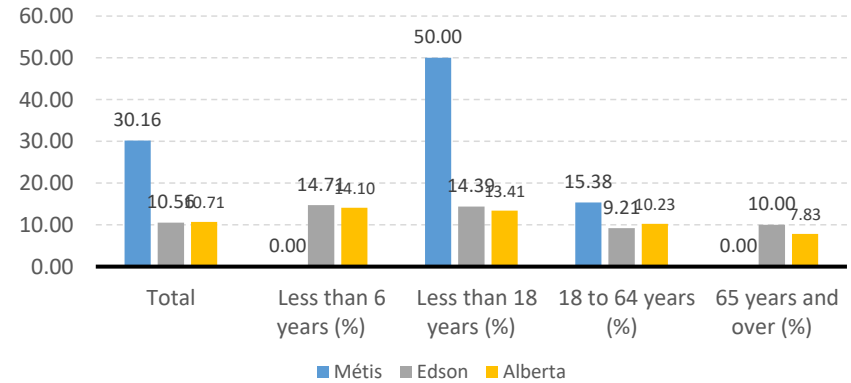
After-Tax Income of Households in 2010



For Métis singles, median after-tax household income is \$60,339, and average after-tax household income is

\$69,155. Métis has lower median and average after-tax income than Edson and Alberta.

Prevalence of Low Income in 2010 Based On After-Tax Low-Income Measure (%)



The prevalence of low income based on after-tax low-income measure is 30.16%.

The percentage of low income is 50.00% for people less than 18 years old, 0.00% for people less than 6 years old, 15.38% for people from 18 to 64 years old, and 0.00% for people over 65 years old.
