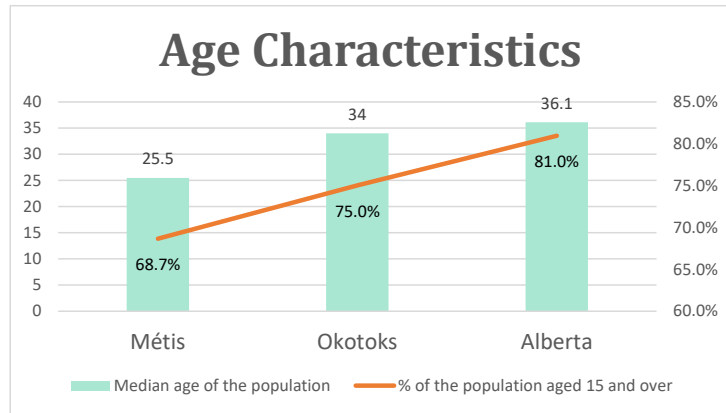

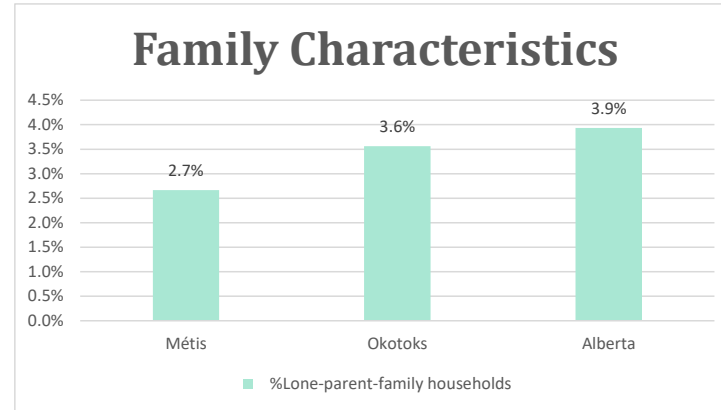

The total population reported with Métis single identity is 750 (Total Métis household is 400), representing 70% of Aboriginal people, accounting for 3.1% of the total population in Okotoks.

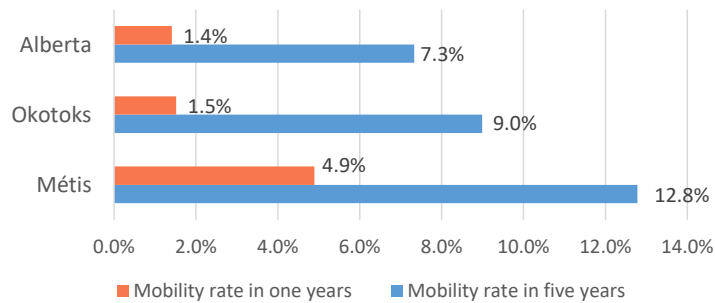


For Métis single identity population, the median age is 25.5 years old, with 68.7% of the population aged 15 and over. As for the total population, the median age is 34.0 in Okotoks and 36.1 years old in Alberta, with 75.0% and 81.0% population aged 15 and over respectively.



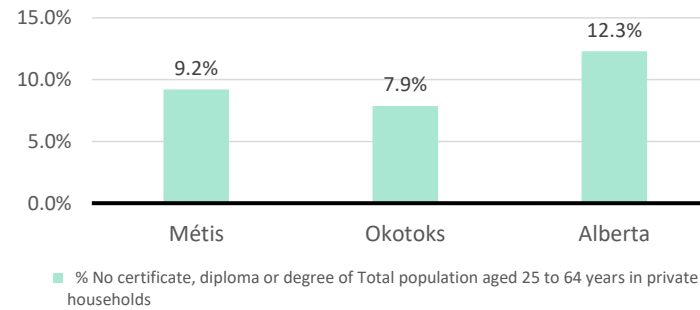
The number of Métis single lone parents household is 20, accounting for 2.7% of the total Métis single private households.

Education



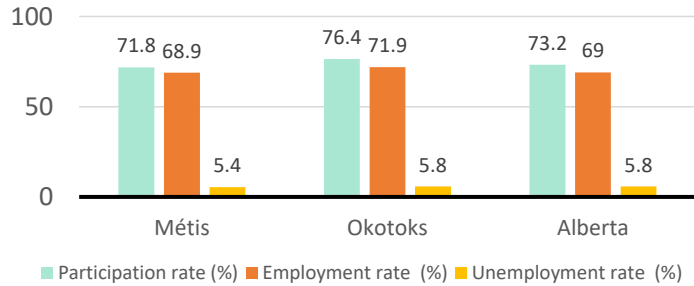
For population aged from 25 to 64 years, 9.2% Métis compared to 7.9% in Okotoks and 12.3% in Alberta have no certificate, diploma or degree.

Labor Force & Housing Statistics

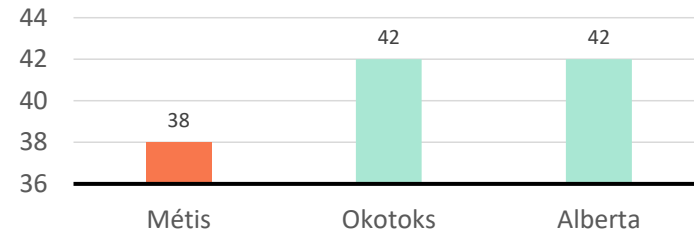
Labour Force Status



Métis participation rate is 71.8%, employment rate is 68.9%, and unemployment rate is 5.4%.

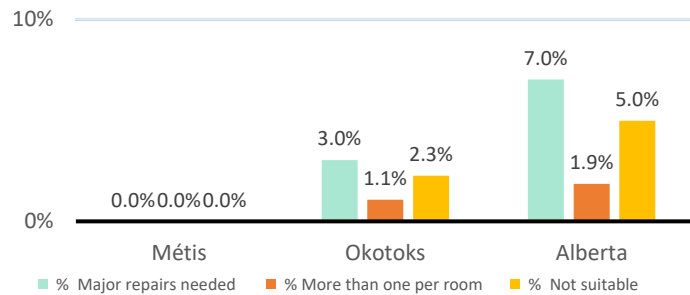
While the participation rate is lower compared with total population in Okotoks and Alberta (76.4% and 73.2%), unemployment rate is also lower.

Average Weeks Worked in 2010



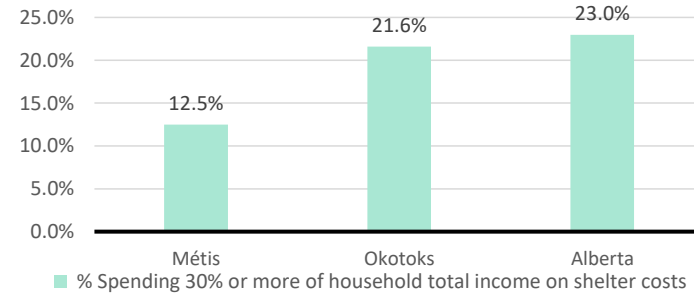
The average weeks worked in 2010 is 38.0 weeks.

Household Characteristics



There are 400 private dwellings occupied by a Métis single household, out of which no Métis single household reported need major repairs, have more than one person per room, or not suitable.

Shelter Costs



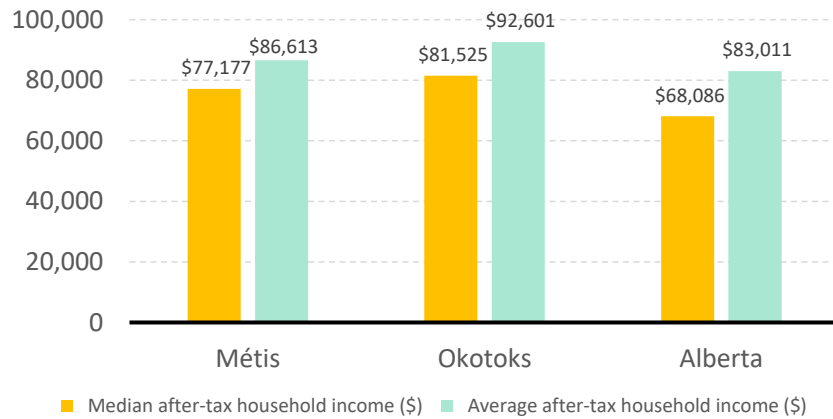
The number of Métis households spending 30% or more of household total income on shelter costs is 50, which is 12.5%

of the total private dwellings occupied by a Métis household, compared to 21.6% of the total population in Okotoks and 23.0% of the total population in Alberta.

Income

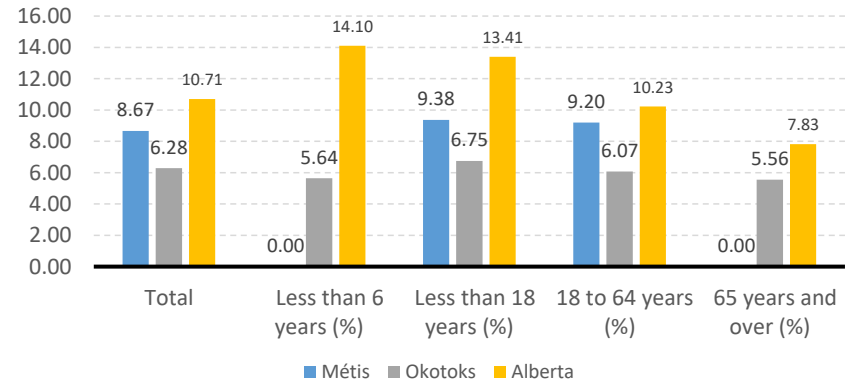
After-Tax Income of Households in 2010



For Métis singles, median after-tax household income is \$77,177, and average after-tax household income is

\$86,613. Métis has lower median and average after-tax income than Okotoks, and higher median and average after-tax income than Alberta.

Prevalence of Low Income in 2010 Based On After-Tax Low-Income Measure (%)



The prevalence of low income based on after-tax low-income measure is 8.67%.

The percentage of low income is 9.38% for people less than 18 years old, 0.00% for people less than 6 years old, 9.20% for people from 18 to 64 years old, and 0.00% for people over 65 years old.
